SPECIAL CONDITIONS (con't):

- All boots, probing sticks, and related gear must be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized between visits to different wetlands to risk the spread of harmful pathogens between populations. - 9. No trapping at ENSP assigned sites without prior approval and coordination with Brian Zarate, ENSP. No trapping at contracted sites without prior coordination with Wendy Walsh, USFWS.
- If an endangered or threatened species is found, Brian Zarate, ENSP biologist must be notified immediately at (908) 236-0173 and an Endangered and Threatened Species Sighting Report form must be submitted within 24-48 hours.
- 11. Upon completion of studies, all turtle capture data must be submitted to Brian Zarate, NJ Div. of Fish & Wildlife, ENSP, PO Box 394, Lebanon, NJ 08833 as well as the Wildlife Permits Unit by January 31 of the following calendar year.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTE</u>: A COPY OF THIS PERMIT AND A COPY OF THE ATTACHED GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR SCIENTIFIC COLLECTING PERMITS MUST BE CARRIED BY ALL PERMITTEES AND SUBPERMITTEES WHILE IN THE FIELD AND SHOWN UPON REQUEST WHILE ENGAGED IN COLLECTION ACTIVITIES. ALL SPECIFIC AND GENERAL CONDITIONS MUST BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO.

Every effort must be made to preserve natural habitats during research and collecting activities.

Any sightings or captures of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife must be reported to the Division of Fish and Wildlife on the enclosed <u>ENDANGERED AND THREATENED WILDLIFE SIGHTING REPORT FORM</u>. The report form must be fully completed and accompanied by a map with the location plotted.

The collection of New Jersey State Endangered and Threatened Species is <u>STRICTLY PROHIBITED</u> unless otherwise authorized.

Entrance to any land must be with the prior permission of the landowner or managing governmental agencies.

Collection of birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, or any other indigenous animals for consumption or profit is prohibited! The patenting, licensing, trademarking, or copyrighting, or the obtaining of any type of legal protection because of or due to the collection of animals under this permit is also prohibited. Any specimens or components of specimens collected under this permit, and the research results derived from collected specimens or components of specimens are to be used for scientific or educational purposes only and may not be used for commercial or other revenue-generating purposes.
